

SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST TURIBIUS OF MOGROVEJO (A.D. 1538-23rd March 1606)

Toribio de Mogrovejo was from an aristocratic Spanish family. He was a very pious child and very well educated. At the age of 33 he was appointed by King Philip II to the position of Head Inquisitor of Granada because of his reputation of being fair and virtuous. In 1578, he was appointed to become Archbishop of Lima, Peru, which he resisted, noting to the king and pope that he wasn't even a priest. Yet, they prevailed and Toribio was speed-run through ordination, being consecrated Archbishop in 1580. Toribio set out for the New World and the Spanish colony in Peru. There he set himself to work, baptising and confirming many, including the future saints Rose of Lima & Martin de Porres. He learned the indigenous languages and fought strenuously for their rights against colonists who would use them practically as slaves. He reformed the clergy, and organised the building of roads, hospitals, and schools, continuing to work up until his death in 1606.
