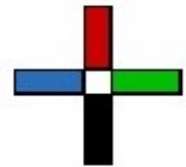

SAINT OF THE WEEK

ST RAPHAEL (Immortal)

Probably the least well-known of the Archangels, St Raphael features in the book of Tobit, where he guides and protects the young Tobias. His name means 'God has healed' in Hebrew, revealing that it is always God's healing power that is at work in him. In the book of Tobit, he is God's messenger (*angelos* in Greek) sent to look after Tobit's son, Tobias. Disguised as a human, he acts as a physician, teaching Tobias how to heal Tobit's blindness, helping him to find his future bride, Sarah, and doing battle with demons. In the Christian tradition, he is also associated with the angel at the pool of Bethesda, in John 5. Often depicted with a staff or a fish, St Raphael is invoked as a patron saint of travellers, young lovers, the sick, the blind, those with mental health struggles, pharmacists, physicians, among many others. St Raphael is a reminder to us that God loves to work his healing power through intermediaries, like us! St Raphael's feast day is the 29th September.
