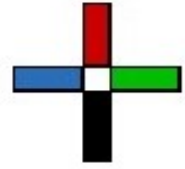

## SAINT OF THE WEEK

### **ST CAMILLUS DE LELLIS (1550–14th July 1614 A.D.)**

Camillus was born in Bucchianico, Italy, the son of a military officer. He was an unruly child with a temper. At sixteen he joined his father in the army. After several years in the army his regiment was disbanded and he ended up in a hospital in Rome for treatment. He was kicked out for quarrelling with everyone, then proceeded to amble away all his possessions. Eventually, he found work as a labourer in a Franciscan Capuchin friary. One of the friars took interest in him and encouraged him despite his ill attitude, leading to his conversion in 1575. He tried to join the Capuchins and began to lead a very ascetical life, doing penance for his past behaviour. Unable to become a friar due to illness, he went to Rome, where he took as his spiritual director St Philip Neri. He focussed on the care of the sick, forming a group of men for this purpose, who would eventually become the Camillians. He was ordained a priest in 1584, and served the sick until he died on the 14th July 1614.
